BOOK-READING SESSIONS

"Sincerely, Your Autistic Child"

Kind Theory's very first book reading session featured the book, "Sincerely, Your Autistic Child" - A diverse collection of autistic voices that highlights how parents can avoid common mistakes and misconceptions, and make their child feel truly accepted, valued, and celebrated for who they are. We were joined by the two authors/contributors of the book, Kayla Rodriguez and Morenike Giwa Onaiwu. This session was prerecorded and later streamed on April 29th, 2022.

Book-Reading with Quincy Hansen

Featuring interviews with young autistic change-makers and addressing issues like self-image, harmful stereotypes, and communication barriers, Quincy Hansen's Shake It Up! aims to build readers' confidence, and inspire them to take action to change the world to be a better place. We had a live book reading session of Shake It Up, by the author Quincy Hansen, which was held on 14th August 2022.
